Subject: "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign under "Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav" (AKAM)


Sir/Madam,

'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav'(AKAM) is being celebrated to commemorate the 75 glorious years of a progressive Independent India. Under the aegis of AKAM, a campaign "Har Ghar Tiranga" has been launched to encourage the citizens to hoist the National Flag of India in their home. For the success of "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign, it is envisaged that more than 10 crore Indian households covering a significant portion of India's population, will hoist the flag during the 'Independence Week' in August 2022. It would encourage citizens to 'bring the Flag home' in the 75th year of India's Independence. "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign would foster a 'personal connect' to the Tricolour among citizens and motivate them to commit themselves to nation building.

2. Government is taking various steps to generate awareness of "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign. In this connection, Ministry of Home Affairs vide D.O letter dated 20.07.2022 (enclosed) has circulated the salient features of Flag Code of India 2002. This is relating to the observance of Har Ghar Tiranga including on handling/disposal of Flags after the event, lowering the national Flags after sunset.

3. To carry out widespread awareness and the effective implementation of Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, all organisations under Ministry of Textiles are requested to fully mobilize institutional resources including that of institutions in States. You are also requested to ensure wide resonance of the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign and related activities, across all social media platforms to make it a people-centric movement, with maximum Jan Bhagidari. It is urged that all the organisations may assist the states in outreach campaigns and distribution of flags.

As you are aware, 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' (AKAM) is being celebrated to commemorate the 75 glorious years of a progressive Independent India. Under the aegis of AKAM, a campaign 'Har Ghar Tiranga' has been launched to encourage the citizens to hoist the National Flag of India in their homes. The display/hoisting/use of the Indian National Flag is governed by the Flag Code of India, 2002 and the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971.

2. The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 30th December, 2021 and paragraph 1.2 of Part-I of the Flag Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under:-

1.2. "The National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven or machine made, cotton/polyester/wool/silk khadi bunting."

3. The Flag Code of India, 2002 has been further amended vide Order dated 20th July, 2022 and clause (xi) of paragraph 2.2 of Part-II of the Flag Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under:-


(xi) "where the Flag is displayed in open or displayed on the house of a member of public, it may be flown day and night;"

4. I am enclosing the salient features of the Flag Code of India, 2002 including changes made therein on 30th December, 2021 & 20th July, 2022. FAQs about the use/display of the Indian National Flag are also enclosed. You are requested to ensure that these are widely disseminated among various organisations/PSUs under your administrative control.

Salient Features of Flag Code of India, 2002

1. The Indian National Flag represents the hopes and aspirations of the people of India. It is the symbol of our national pride and there is universal affection and respect for, and loyalty to, the National Flag. It occupies a unique and special place in the emotions and psyche of the people of India.
2. The hoisting/use/display of the Indian National Flag is governed by the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971 and the Flag Code of India, 2002. Some of salient features of the Flag Code of India, 2002 are listed below for the information of the public:-
 - a) The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 30st December, 2021 and National Flag made of polyester or machine made Flag have been allowed. Now, the National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven or **machine made, cotton/polyester/wool/silk khadi bunting.**
 - b) A member of public, a private organization or an educational institution may hoist/display the National Flag on all days and occasions, ceremonial or otherwise, consistent with the dignity and honour of the National Flag.
 - c) The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 19th July, 2022 and clause (xi) of paragraph 2.2 of Part-II of the Flag Code of India was replaced by the following clause:-
 - (xi) **“where the Flag is displayed in open or displayed on the house of a member of public, it may be flown day and night;”**
 - d) The National Flag shall be rectangular in shape. The Flag can be of any size but the ratio of the length to the height (width) of the Flag shall be 3:2.
 - e) Whenever the National Flag is displayed, it should occupy the position of honour and should be distinctly placed.
 - f) A damaged or dishevelled Flag shall not be displayed.

- g) The Flag should not be flown from a single masthead simultaneously with any other flag or flags.
- h) The Flag should not be flown on any vehicle except of the dignitaries mentioned in Section IX of Part III of the Flag Code, such as President, Vice-President, Prime-Minister, Governors etc.
- i) No other flag or bunting should be placed higher than or above or side by side with the National Flag.
